- In the opening remarks, the Chairperson welcomed all the members present for the fourth meeting of the IQAC.
- At the directions of the Chair, the Director (IQAC), presented the action taken report against the last meeting, inclusive of the Specific Agenda Points discussed therein. On acceptance and confirmation of the minutes and ATR of the third meeting of the IQAC, the meeting proceeded with the following agenda items:
- Inclusion of a few senior members in the IQAC of the University.

Five members including Senior Academicians and Administrators are proposed as a regular member of the IQAC; (a) Three Internal members -(Prof. Widhi Dubey - Director, SoS, Prof. Sanjay Sharma - Associate Dean Research and Prof. Avireni - Director, SoE) (b) Two External Members -(Sh. M.L.Sharma and Prof. S.N.Gupta)

2. To review initiatives taken and to suggest guidelines for flexible curriculum (to be implemented from July 2018) as per AICTE's new guidelines.

> The University has been offering flexible curriculum for its entire academic program with CBCS/Elective course system. It was agreed that the School of Engineering has to implement the course curriculum in toto, as circulated by AICTE with effect from July 2018.



3. To discuss and analyze the feedback of stakeholders.

Feedback received was discussed at length and the recommendations were:

- Teachers must be sent for Orientation, Refresher Course and Teaching Methodology workshop for continuous development, preferably during December-January and/or May-July.
- The latest study material, be it in the form of Video Lectures from all across the globe must be demonstrated/explained to the students.
- The School of Management, as expressively quoted by students, must focus on primarily on the Case Studies, Problem Solving, Current market scenario and live debate and discussions.
- 4. To discuss the 'Demand Ratio' for Student Admissions and to suggest guidelines for Post Graduate Admissions in technical programs.

Demand Ratio is the 'Number of applications Against Sanctioned Intake in Each Program'. For the first 5 Years, the average Demand Ratio is 2.58

To discuss existing research policy and review the academic updates of research scholars.

Prof. Sanjay Sharma, Associate Dean Research, apprised the current research and it was recommended that policy needs suitable amendments to include interdisciplinary research and also contribute to the enrichment of the latest R & D developments across the country and globe. Action to be initiated by the Associate Dean Research.

Prof. Sanjay Sharma also added that the number of application and thereby provisional registrations for Ph.D Research Scholar for the session 2018-19 has improved greatly in comparison to the numbers in the last years.

- 6. To discuss the developments in physical and IT Infrastructure.
 - The internet bandwidth has been increased from 100mbps to 150 mbps through Vodafone, as service provider.
 - A separate lab has been established with dedicated ten computer systems having Adobe Creative Software worth approx. Rs. 4.5 lakhs.
 - Towards the physical facility enhancement, lifts have been made operational in both the buildings forming Law, Management, Design & Journalism Blocks.
 - Constructive developments are in fast progress for expansion towards a full fledged 'Training and Placement Cell (Colored Purchase)

- To review the student participation in different activities at institute and interinstitute level.
 - Event Calendar as shared by the Students Development Officers of the University indicated that about 18 Events would be conducted centrally at University level which would witness the participation of around 6000 students and visitors.

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For Environmental Consciousness: Subjects relating to Environmental Consciousness have been incorporated in curriculum in the 1st year across all faculties. Prof. T.K.Das proposed that the Department of Agriculture would work for Organic Farming and Horticulture and these may be initiated at a small level in the vacant land within campus.

For Institutional Distinctiveness: The Distinctiveness practiced at the University were, "Internships for all final semesters across all faculties, Center for entrepreneurship development, Center for Training and Corporate relations and Adopting the surrounding villages for WTP, Legal Awareness, Social upliftment (Zarurat), Clubs (Technical, Social and Cultural)", which needs to be strengthened to attain a higher recognition level.

Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) is very essential for the excellence in Higher Education. These are interrelated concepts. Thus in order to have a quality oriented academic, there should be a strong administrative background.

Academic Audit: - Academic audit can be understood as a scientific and systematic method of reviewing the quality of academic process in the institution. It is related with the quality assurance and enhancing the quality of academic activities in HEIs.

Administrative Audit: - It can be defined as a process of evaluating the efficiency and effectiveness of the administrative procedure. It includes assessment of policies, strategies & functions of the various administrative departments' control of the overall administrative system etc.

Major objectives of AAA:

- To understand the existing system and assess the strengths and weaknesses of the Departments and Administrative Units and to suggest the methods for improvement and for overcoming the weaknesses.
- 2. To identify the bottlenecks in the existing administrative mechanisms and to identify the opportunities for academic reforms, administrative reforms and examination reforms etc
- To evaluate the optimum utilization of financial and other resources.
- 4. To suggest the methods for continuous improvement of quality keeping in mind criteria and reports by NAAC and other bodies.

- A student website to help disseminate information among all students and to all the constituent units of the University will be welcomed by the students.
- The University may initiate steps to prepare alumni profile for various undergraduate courses as an additional instrument to indicate the success of the programs. This will add a significant outcome measure and show that the goals and objectives of the program have been successfully met with.

OVERALL OBSERVATIONS

- Multiple tasks assigned to majority of teaching faculty needs to be minimized in due course of time.
- Students have expressed their desire to have more books useful for their course programme and the convenient public transport facilities.
- Many of the students are not aware of the students' welfare facilities and medical facilities.
- In Science Departments, there is a slight delay in the purchase of chemicals, glassware and other essential instruments.
- There is an ample scope for University-industry linkage so as to make use of the resources, enriching syllabus as well as sharing the teaching work.
- The University is thoughtful of establishing some important Applied Science
 Departments. Research in these departments is slow and needs encouragement.
- Paucity of senior faculty/Professors is observed in the Faculty of Engineering and Management.
- 8. Although JU has succeeded in increasing the number of books, there appears to be paucity in the number of copies of prescribed text books for some of the courses. Interaction with students confirmed the difficulty they experience in finding text books especially during the examinations. Currently Wi Fi facilities seem to be effective only in and around the library. Students reported on the difficulty they experience accessing to Internet and online information in other areas.
- The University has introduced several new features in teaching-learning methods
 to augment competency and practical skills at the undergraduate and
 postgraduate levels.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Steps may be taken to create minimum number of teaching and non-teaching position and recruiting them at the earliest possible.
- Basic amenities like drinking water, internet connectivity, UPS needs to be improved in all the Departments.
- All departments, centres, library and students welfare section may be provided with separate Computer & Printer systems, internet and UPS facilities.
- Enough buildings space is already made available and in order to make the teachinglearning effective, there is immediate need for meeting/media rooms in every faculty.
- 5. The University website with all details is to be updated frequently.
- The University may consider making provision for recognizing/awarding the good services of the teaching and non-teaching faculty.
- Teachers' participation in the community services and executing the social responsibilities by sharing the knowledge with the society is to be encouraged.
- University, though the department of its Faculty, must initiate some additional measures to help in the training and placement of students who have backlogs/due papers / lesser percentage in Secondary and/or Senior Secondary Level.
- 10. The currents reflects that students are more inclined towards Start-Ups (Entrepreneurship) and therefore the E-Cell/Innovation and Incubation Cell must take necessary action to foster the same, partially ensuring employability of the student as a employee or employer
- 10. The Post-Graduate Departments should be permitted to include the experts from identified interdisciplinary areas of the subject for BOS so as to enrich the syllabus, teaching, research as well as promoting the training and placement.
- 11. The Students aboard Program, initiated by JU LC -IAESTE, needs to be strengthened, well promoted and student project's (by interns) be diversified across all Faculty of the University.
- 12. University may think of instituting foundation lecture series by inviting eminent scholars, scientists of repute and noted personalities to expose the students and the faculty to the new and

 13. Looking at the rapid developments in the University and its commitment to provide access to higher education for the students of rural areas, it is advisable that the area specific add-on courses, skill development courses and short-term job oriented courses may be introduced.




